

Overview

The 36th annual WMBIN symposium provides an overview of current practice guidelines and treatment strategies for people with acquired brain injuries in interdisciplinary rehabilitation, from acute management through extended social, psychiatric and functional adjustment to community settings with an emphasis on effective and validated interventions.

Target Audience

Case managers, nurses, nurse practitioners, occupational therapists, physical therapists, physicians, psychologists, rehabilitation program administrators, social workers, speech-language pathologists, students, therapeutic recreation specialists, brain injury survivors and family members

Outcomes

Attendees will be able to describe the need and rationale for developing and implementing telehealth interventions for post-acute brain injury rehabilitation as well as evidence-based strategies to formulate and facilitate remote group interventions. They will be able to explain neurobehavioral programming and discuss ways to implement this into their practice. Attendees also will be able to identify compassion fatigue in the professional caregiver and discuss strategies for avoiding and managing this common condition. Those in attendance will gain an understanding of the various professional perspectives of caring for those with a brain injury and management strategies to provide the best outcomes through the panel presentations and discussion.
