# MARY FREE BED THRIVE GALA RAISES \$240,000 TO SUPPORT ORTHOTICS & PROSTHETICS + BIONICS

The Mary Free Bed Foundation's ninth annual Thrive gala was held on November 5. The Roaring 20s-themed celebration kept Mary Free Bed friends, volunteers and supporters doing the Charleston well into the night.

This year, Thrive benefited the Mary Free Bed Orthotics & Prosthetics + Bionics (O&P+B) program which serves hundreds of patients at eight locations across the state of Michigan.

Jordan Carson, WOOD TV8, eightWest co-host and Live Local-Give Local director, emceed the event. Mary Free Bed's CEO, Kent Riddle, showcased some of Mary Free Bed's O&P+B successes and expressed gratitude for community leaders and healthcare organizations that wholeheartedly provide care throughout West Michigan.

In a moving introduction, Mary Free Bed O&P+B patient, Pam Buschle, shared her story. Nine years ago, Pam developed sepsis and, as a result, had all four limbs amputated to save her life.

Pam thanked her Mary Free Bed care team for believing that she would be able to live life to the fullest again, saying, "Their work gives people freedom and independence that once seemed impossible."

At the end of the night, guests answered the call by exceeding the \$40,000 challenge match supported by CareLinc, Dave and Carol Burgess, and an anonymous donor.



# MARY FREE BED RECOGNIZED BY NEWSWEEK AND U.S. NEWS & WORLD REPORT

For the third straight year, Mary Free bed has been recognized as one of America's Best Physical Rehabilitation Centers by *Newsweek* health care analysts. Mary Free Bed ranked 1st among Michigan rehabilitation facilities and 11th nationally.



Additionally, *U.S. News & World Report* released its annual list of Best Hospitals for Rehabilitation, and Mary Free Bed was again rated one of the nation's top providers for the second year in a row. Of the 799 rehabilitation organizations evaluated by U.S. News health care analysts, Mary Free Bed is #17 in the United States.

#### MobileMat Platform with FootMat Software

Used in the Mary Free Bed Motion Analysis Lab, this advanced pressure-mapping system will help us analyze and treat patients diagnosed with cerebral palsy, brain injury, stroke, multi-trauma and spina bifida. (\$8,700)

#### Freedom Concepts Adaptive Bike

Adaptive bikes help patients get back into the familiar feeling of being independent and mobile while ensuring a stable, safe cycling experience. As part of recreational therapy, biking is a low-stress activity that reduces joint pain, improves hand-eye coordination and provides beneficial cardiovascular exercise in and around the hospital. (\$4,400)

#### **Ocutech Image Minifiers**

The Association for the Blind and Visually Impaired (ABVI) supports people with visual field constriction, but currently has no viable field expanders. These devices can be held up to the eye or mounted to eyeglasses – effectively doubling the field of vision for people with constricted vision. (\$225)

#### Lee Montgomery Athlete Assistance Fund (LMAAF)

In the spirit and honor of Coach Lee, the goal of this fund is to give all individuals an opportunity to become the best athletes they can be, both on and off the field of play. A gift to support the LMAAF enables new athletes to explore the world of wheelchair and adaptive sports. It can also help seasoned athletes achieve next-level sports opportunities.

Athletes can request up to \$1,000 in assistance. Funds can help alleviate the costs of joining a Mary Free Bed WAS team, participating in Paralympic or junior national sports team tryouts, or attending the Mary Free Bed Junior Wheelchair Sports Camp. (Any amount is appreciated.)
