#### **RESTORING HOPE AND FREEDOM** ONE BEAM AT A TIME

We are excited to share that construction has begun on Joan Secchia Children's Rehabilitation Hospital—a state-of-the-art facility dedicated to helping children achieve their best possible outcomes through compassionate care, innovation and interdisciplinary collaboration. This will be the first hospital of its kind in Michigan.

This transformative project remains on track for completion by the end of 2026. Once complete, Joan Secchia Children's Rehabilitation Hospital will deliver advanced rehabilitation care for children and

families, doubling inpatient capacity from 12 beds to 24 and expanding outpatient capacity by 20%.

The unique partnership between Mary Free Bed Rehabilitation and Corewell Health Helen DeVos Children's Hospital brings together our combined expertise, resources, and passion, paving the way for a new and elevated standard of care in pediatric rehabilitation.



## **DESIGNING FOR JOY**

Our design efforts are advancing quickly! Key phases concept, schematic, and design development—are complete. All aspects of the building will be infused with sparks of curiosity and play to encourage movement and success at all ability levels. A "Wow Committee" has been formed to incorporate engaging non-clinical features, such as interactive art installations and sensory play zones, ensuring the hospital is a warm, uplifting and inclusive space for children and families.



### **INNOVATIVE PROGRAMS AND SERVICES**

The hospital will feature cutting-edge technologies, including Smart-Room capabilities, in-ceiling gait systems, and Bioness® Integrated Therapy Systems, enhancing care for both inpatient and outpatient therapy. Expanded services will include:

- Inpatient and outpatient therapy
- Orthotics, prosthetics, and bionics
- Intensive and outpatient feeding programs
- Autism diagnostic services

Together, we are building a legacy of hope and healing for children and families.
