

In 1891, a small group of Grand Rapids women recognized the need to help patients with limited financial means to pay for health care. They passed a little black purse, asking anyone named Mary—or who knew a woman named Mary—to donate 10 cents. Mary was the most popular female name at the time, so the women quickly raised enough money to endow a single hospital bed. And so, the storied legacy of the "Mary free bed" began.

With an increasing need for support and services, the growing group of women formed the Mary Free Bed Guild in 1911. They've been responding to community needs ever since.

- The Mary Free Bed Guild brought the first physical therapist to Grand Rapids.
- Working with Grand Rapids Public Schools officials, educational services were developed for children with disabilities.
- The Brace Shop, a precursor to Orthotics & Prosthetics, was established in 1938.
- Developed in 1946, the Juvenile Amputee Training Program became a national model and was featured in *Life* magazine.
- In 1953, Mary Free Bed began providing adult rehabilitation.
- In 2015, a state-of-the-art hospital specifically for rehabilitation opened as part of a \$66 million expansion and renovation project.
- In 2021, Mary Free Bed opened a \$40.7 million, 60-bed rehabilitation hospital in Saginaw, Michigan, in partnership with Covenant HealthCare.
- In 2023, Mary Free Bed announced a new state-of-the-art \$70 million pediatric

- rehabilitation hospital to be built on the Grand Rapids Campus in partnership with Corewell Health Helen Devos Children's Hospital.
- The Valley Health Winchester Medical
  Center Mary Free Bed Rehabilitation Tower,
  planned to open in December 2026, is a
  new, state-of-the-art facility in Virginia and
  will offer a comprehensive range of adult
  services, including inpatient rehabilitation
  and outpatient therapy services. The threestory freestanding tower will include 50
  inpatient beds and connect via Valley Health
  Winchester Medical Center.
- Mary Free Bed is expanding its rehabilitation services to West Virginia with the announcement of a partnership with Vandalia Health at Charleston Area Medical Center (CAMC). As part of the partnership, the two organizations will work together to build a new 50-bed rehabilitation hospital on the Vandalia Health CAMC General Hospital Campus.



### STATISTICAL PORTRAIT

From one humble bed in the late 1800s, Mary Free Bed is now Michigan's most comprehensive rehabilitation provider and one of the largest non-profit rehabilitation systems in the nation. Kent Riddle became CEO of Mary Free Bed in 2011.

Here's a synopsis of our system's track record. The Mary Free Bed System includes the Grand Rapids Campus plus nine Michigan hospitals where we manage care or provide treatment:

- There are 2,552 system-wide employees.
- We have more than 45 board-certified physiatrists and over 108 providers in total.
- The number of inpatient beds on the Grand Rapids Campus has more than doubled from 80 to 195.
- Since its establishment in 2011, the Mary Free Bed Rehabilitation System offers 479 inpatient beds, and growing. Our deep partnerships span Michigan, Indiana, Virginia and West Virginia.
- Established in 2012, the Mary Free Bed Foundation has raised more than \$124 million.
- We're home to a fully accredited Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation Residency Program.
- But clearly the most important accomplishment is the dramatic increase in the number of patients served. Today, Mary Free Bed has served more than 102,000 patients.

Mary Free Bed is a not-for-profit hospital accredited by the Joint Commission and holds multiple accreditations from the Commission on Accreditation of Rehabilitation Facilities.
